# Hope VI Family Self-sufficiency Program



## WHO?

All Public Housing residents and non-residents are eligible to apply for the Hope VI Family Self-Sufficiency Program.

## WHAT?

The Family Self-Sufficiency Program is designed to assist families in achieving the goal of becoming self sufficient.

Program participants establish goals that will increase their incomes. This is usually accomplished by enhancing educational and vocational skills.

Participants identify barriers that may prevent them from accomplishing their goals.

The barriers may include lack of childcare, transportation, or funds needed for education. A CHA case manager assists with coordination of community resources.

Hope VI FSS participants reside at the First Ward, Rivermere, Arbor Glen, and The Park at Oaklawn Communities.
